

ORDER

Jacket Fire Rehabilitation Area Closure

COCONINO NATIONAL FOREST  
Mormon Lake Ranger District

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 261.50 (a) and/or (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area described in this order and Exhibit A\* within the Coconino National Forest until further notice.

- (1) Possess or use any type of motorized vehicle off National Forest System roads, **36 CFR 261.56.**

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- (1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission;
- (2) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty;

\*This area affects portions of the Coconino National Forest as generally described within the following perimeter: From the intersection of the 345KV powerline road and the Peaks and Mormon Lake Ranger District boundary then east to its intersection with the Coconino National Forest boundary; then south along the Forest boundary to the rim of Anderson Mesa; then following the Rim north and westward to the 345KV powerline road; then northward along the powerline road. Roads that will remain open to motorized travel: FR 126, FR 233, FR 9476V, and the powerline road (9481A, 740A). See attached map, Exhibit A.

Done at Flagstaff, Arizona this 5th day of August, 2004. This order becomes effective on August 6, 2004, at 8:00 a.m. and will remain in effect until rescinded.
