QUARTERLY SCHEDULE OF PROPOSED ACTIONS

October through December 2004

Enclosed is the latest edition of the "Schedule of Proposed Actions" (SOPA). It has been developed to keep you informed about projects on the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest. This list identifies all projects that we are currently analyzing or are planning to analyze during the third quarter of calendar year 2004 (October through December).

As you will notice, our SOPA has a different look. This is because the Forest Service is developing a national database to track key planning information and automatically generate SOPAs in a consistent manner. The attached SOPA is our second attempt. We will follow this format, with changes as the database and process is improved, in all future quarterly SOPA updates. The SOPA is also available on the web at <http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/htnf/>.

Some projects that appeared on previous editions have been removed because we have finished the analysis and made a decision and the appeal period (if applicable) has ended. In other cases, we've removed the projects from the list because we were unable to pursue them for various reasons such as lack of funding or conflicts with other Forest priorities.

For many of these projects you will receive additional information during our public input phase. This may occur by letter, public notices in local newspapers, or in public meetings. We invite you to participate in the planning of the projects listed in this schedule. If you have specific questions regarding any of these projects, please call the identified contact person directly.

As before, this schedule is not all-inclusive. Some small projects or minor activities may come up after this publication that requires our immediate attention. In some cases the decision document may be signed before the next quarterly listing.

There are several points in the planning process when you can be most helpful and influential, exact steps and timing vary depending on the complexity of the project. All future dates listed are estimates and some of our work priorities continued to be modified. Your participation early in the process will promote better decisions and ensure that your input is considered. Office contact information is provided on the attached schedule.
