

ACCESS: Travel US Highway 101 to the Duckabush Recreation Area, approx. 22 miles north of Hoodsport. Turn west onto the F.S. Road #2510 (Duckabush River Road) and drive



6 miles to the entrance of Collins Campground which is located on the left side of the road.

FACILITIES: There are 16 campsites, 10 that will accommodate tents, trailers, and RVs up to 21 feet in length. Six of the campsites are tent sites with spurs for parking. Tables, fire rings, vault toilets are available within the campground. Please pack out your garbage and leave a clean campsite. No potable water available.

SETTING: Collins is a quiet campground located along the shore of the Duckabush River. Several of the campsites are near the river.

OPPORTUNITIES: Hiking, fishing, hunting, waterfall viewing and river walks are possible in the area. The Duckabush trailhead is located one mile west of Collins Campground.

Murhut Falls Trail #828 is 1.3 miles up # 2530 road. Interozem Historic Cabin, Ranger Hole Trailhead (a trail to a popular fishing area), and Interozem Interpretive Nature Trail are located one mile east of the campground.

WARNING: River contains swift water, rapids, and waterfalls. **River is not floatable.** Use extreme caution in or near the water.

FEE: The regular \$10.00 camping fee will cover two licensed passenger vehicles and a maximum of eight persons. **The two-vehicle rule may consist of any combination of the following:** *Two passenger cars, trucks, and/or recreation vehicles (NOTE: boat trailers and recreation trailers are not considered passenger vehicles).*

An additional \$5.00 fee is charged for each passenger vehicle over the two-vehicle rule. The 8 person maximum capacity per campsite still applies.
