

REGION-WIDE:

Invasive Plant Project - Pacific Northwest Region

The Regional Forester is preparing an EIS to amend Forest Plan direction to enhance our ability to protect native ecosystems from invasive and non-invasive plants. The analysis will build on the region's existing program by improving our ability to: prevent the introduction of invasive plant species; improve detection and rapid response to new infestations; control existing populations; and provide for restoration of native species and habitats that have been invaded. The Notice of Intent was printed in *Federal Register* on Wednesday, August 28, 2002 (p. 55194). The draft EIS is expected to be filed with EPA and available for 45-day public review July 2003. Final EIS is scheduled to be completed December 2003.

Release of Names

The Office of General Council at the Department of Agriculture has determined that the names and addresses of persons who respond to solicitations for comments for Forest Service projects are subject to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) and subject to public review. Comments received in response to the actions in this publication,

including names and addresses of those who comment, will be considered part of the public record on the proposed action and will be available for public inspection. Comments received anonymously will be accepted and considered, however, those who submit anonymous comments will not have standing to appeal the subsequent decision under 36 CFR Part 215.

Additionally, pursuant to 7 CFR 1.27(d), any person may request that the agency withhold a submission from the public record by showing how FOIA permits such confidentiality. Persons requesting such confidentiality should be aware that, under FOIA, confidentiality may be granted only in very limited circumstances, such as to protect trade secrets. The Forest Service will inform the requester of the agency's decision regarding the request for confidentiality, and where the request is denied, the agency will return the submission and notify the requester that the comments may be resubmitted with or without name and address within 15 days.

Incidental Special Uses, Forest-Wide Supervisor's Office, Detroit RD, McKenzie River RD, Middle Fork RD, and Sweet Home RD.

All units on the Forest will periodically issue permits for the following types of uses throughout the year, as requested and if approved: Noncommercial Group Uses (over 75 people) that includes weddings, filming/still photography, special events, recreation events, etc.

Horse Creek Late-Successional Reserve (LSR) Plan

Late-Successional Reserves were designated in the 1994 Northwest Forest Plan Record of Decision for the purpose of maintaining functional, interactive, late-successional and old growth forest ecosystems. A plan will be prepared for the Horse Creek LSR on the McKenzie River Ranger District, to identify long-term goals. The plan will recommend specific future actions to improve late-successional habitat conditions at the stand and landscape levels. Other potential site-specific projects such as prescribed burning, road management, and habitat restoration, will also be reviewed in the plan.

Heritage Expedition to Obsidian Cliffs on the McKenzie River Ranger District

McKenzie River RD

The McKenzie River Ranger District held their second heritage expedition on September 9, 2002. On the first day, the seven public participants met at the Ranger Station to receive some background training and a “hands on” flint knapping session with Don Day, a Grand Ronde tribal member and U of O anthropology student. That night, the

expedition camped at the Horse Creek Group Camp.

From Tuesday thru Friday, the group hiked into and explored the scenic Obsidian Cliffs “limited entry” area, which all agreed was a spectacular setting to base the expedition. Equipment was brought in by Forest Service pack animals. The base camp south of Obsidian Falls was home for the next three evenings.

The primary heritage stewardship activities included archeological survey and monitoring of the area, under the guidance of Archeologist Eric Bergland. Expedition participants learned how to identify flintknapping tools used at the obsidian source by Native people for so many years. The group mapped the discovery location of a hammerstone and several small abrading tools collected at the site.

On the return to McKenzie River Ranger Station, Friday, September 13, the expedition visited Dee Wright Observatory at McKenzie Pass. A great time was had by all!
