All Enoree Rifle Ranges

Regulations: All weapons must meet South Carolina firearm safety standards. Pistols, shotguns and rifles are allowed. Use stationary paper targets only. Skeet shooting is not permitted.

Fees: none

Season: year-round, day use.

Directions: Fairforest Rifle Range

Located in Union County next to Fairforest Campground. From Union take SC Secondary Route 16 southwest for 6 miles.

Leeds Rifle Range Located in Chester County. From Highway 72 go north on SC Secondary Route 25 for 2.1 miles to SC Secondary Route 49. Continue north on SC Route 49 for 3.6 miles to SC Secondary Route 574; turn left (northwest) and drive 0.1 mile to Forest Service Road 307; turn left (southwest) and drive 0.6 mile.

Philson Crossroads Rifle Range

Located in Laurens County. From Whitmire take Highway 72 west for 10 miles to SC Secondary Route 26. Turn right (northwest) and drive 4 miles. The rifle range is on the right side of the road.

Indian Creek Rifle Range Located in Newberry County. From Newberry take SC Route 121 north for 9.4 miles.

Amenities:

Fairforest, Leeds, and Philson Crossroads Rifle Ranges:

* Backstops placed at 25- and 100-yard intervals

Indian Creek Rifle Range:

* Backstops placed at 35- and 100-yard intervals

* One shooting bench is accessible to disabled visitors

* Paved path to backstops

* Paved parking lot
