The Enoree Ranger District offers nine seasonal campgrounds. These campgrounds have designated campsites in open areas surrounded by woods. The surrounding forest environment provides an opportunity for many recreational activities such as wildlife and plant observation, fishing, hiking, and photography. Abundant wildlife populations provide some of the most desirable hunting areas in the upstate.

All Enoree Seasonal Camps:

Fees: \$5/night, \$50/month, \$150/season.

- Sites are first come, first served.
- Each campground has a self-service pay station.
- Campers have 30 minutes to select a site and pay the fee.
- An Enoree Ranger District seasonal camp permit is good at any of these nine seasonal camps. Permit holders may move to a different seasonal camp if there is an open camp site.
- All camping equipment must be removed from the campground by the closing date on the permit or the permit holder will be fined and charged for abandoned property.

Safety: Care should be taken in the woods during big-game season. Wear blaze orange.

Season: Hunting season. Contact one of the District Offices for exact dates. Group camping is available upon request at other times of year.

Note:

- Off-highway vehicles (OHVs) are not allowed in the forest. OHVs are allowed on designated OHV trails only.
- South Carolina fishing and hunting license and regulations apply on all national forest land.

Collins Creek Campground–Directions: From Whitmire, take SC Route 121 northeast for 3.2 miles to SC Secondary Route 45. Turn right (southeast) and drive for 4.2 miles to Forest Service Road 393. Turn right (southwest) and drive for 0.6 mile.

Facilities: Water faucets located around campground, vault toilet, and hot outdoor shower.

Fairforest Campground–Directions: From Union take SC Secondary Route 16 southwest for 6 miles. Turn right into campground and rifle range area. Campground is on the left.

Facilities: Hand pump (Boil water 5 minutes before drinking.) and chemical toilet

Herbert Campground–Directions: From Carlisle, take SC Secondary Route 37 for 1.3 miles. Turn right onto Forest Service Road 404 and drive 0.2 mile to the campground.

Facilities: Vault oilets and an accessible hot shower.

Leeds Campground–Directions: From Chester, take SC Route 72 southwest for 12.1 miles to SC Secondary Route 25. Turn right (north) and drive 2.1 miles to SC Secondary Route 49. Continue north on SC Secondary Route 49 for 3.6 miles to SC Secondary Route 574. Turn left (northwest) and drive 0.3 mile to the Leeds Campground Road.

Facilities: Centrally-located water faucets around campground and vault toilets

Poulus Loop Campground–Directions: From Lockhart, take SC Route 9 southeast for 5 miles to SC Secondary Route 49. Turn right (southwest) and drive for 0.7 mile to Forest Service Road 301. Turn right (west) and drive 3.1 miles to Forest Service Road 301-E. Turn right (north) and drive 0.5 mile to the campground.

Facilities: Vault toilet

Rocky Branch Campground–Directions: From Newberry, take SC Route 34 northwest 18 miles to Forest Service Road 412. Turn left (north) and drive 2.4 miles to the campground.

Facilities: Hand pump (Boil water 5 minutes before drinking.) and vault toilet

Sedalia Campground–Directions: From Union, take SC Route 49 southwest for 8 miles to State Road 481. Turn left (southwest) and drive 1.9 miles to the campground on the left side of the road.

Facilities: Centrally-located water faucets around campground, cold shower and rental toilet

Tip Top Campground–Directions: From Whitmire, take SC Route 72 west for 9 miles. Turn left into campground

Facilities: Vault toilet

Willow Oak Campground–Directions: From Newberry, take SC Route 121 north for 9.5 miles to US 176. Turn right (southeast) and drive 2 miles to Forest Service Road 387. Turn left (north) and drive 3.1 miles to Forest Service Road 386. Turn left and drive 1.7 miles to the campground.

Facilities: Vault toilet
