Highlights

The rolling hills of Sumter National Forest near Chester are home to 9 miles of easy-to-moderate loops know collectively as Woods Ferry Horse Trail. The trails run over a terrain that's primarily red clay and is a wonderful interruption from the area's typical pine trails. This area has a hardwood canopy of poplars, maples, and sweet gums. Look for deer, turkeys, toredtail hawks, quail, blue heron, and even the rare osprey.

Directions: From Chester, travel west on SC 9 through Wilksburg to a junction with Chester County S-49. Turn left (south) and follow to the first road on the right. Worthy's Ferry Road (Chester County S-535). Continue straight after the pavement ends to FS 301C and turn left. There is a parking area with gravel to the left. The trail begins in the parking area.

Camping: Woods Ferry Recreation Area has 28 campsites.

Difficulty level: easy to moderate

Fees: none

Length: 9 miles

Restrictions: Horses must be shod.

Safety: Care should be taken in the woods during big-game season: wear blaze orange.

Season: year-round

Surface type: dirt

Travel time: varies
